Powerball Jackpot for Saturday Drawing at \$415 Million

Wednesday night Powerball drawing had \$50,000 and \$150,000 winners from Wisconsin

Wisconsin had two lucky players from the Wednesday, May 4 *Powerball* drawing. Each player matched four out of five numbers plus the *Powerball* which earns them the \$50,000 prize. The first player from Pleasant Prairie won \$50,000, while the second player from Hudson added Power Play to increase their winnings to \$150,000.

The winning numbers from the Wednesday, May 4 drawing were 30, 47, 57, 66, and 69. The *Powerball* was 3 and the Power Play number was 3. The winning tickets from Wednesday's drawing were sold at:

- Stateline Citgo at 12720 North Sheridan Road in Pleasant Prairie (\$50,000 winning ticket)
- Kwik Trip at 2401 Crestview Drive in Hudson (\$150,000 winning ticket)

Since there was not a *Powerball* jackpot winner Wednesday night, the jackpot continues to grow. The *Powerball* jackpot for Saturday night's drawing is now at \$415 million (\$269.7 million cash).

Tickets must be purchased by 9:00 p.m. to be included in the Saturday, May 7 drawing:

- Each ticket costs \$2 per play
- Choose five different numbers 1-69 and one *Powerball* number 1-26
- Sign your ticket and check it as soon as possible to avoid missing out on any prize you may have won

While the jackpot gets the most attention, there are other prizes to be won in *Powerball*. Prizes range from \$4 for matching just the *Powerball* to \$1 million for matching all five numbers (but not the *Powerball*). For an extra \$1 per play, you can choose Power Play to increase your non-jackpot winnings which will be multiplied by the drawing's Power Play number. For example, if your prize is \$50,000 and the Power Play number is 5, you win \$250,000 just by adding Power Play. The \$1 million prize automatically becomes \$2 million with Power Play.

The mission of Wisconsin Lottery is to provide property tax relief to Wisconsin homeowners. Since the sale of the first lottery ticket in September 1988, the Lottery has generated more than \$3.87 billion in property tax relief for Wisconsin homeowners, \$766 million in commissions for Wisconsin businesses, and more than \$7.14 billion in prizes for players.



The odds of winning the Powerball jackpot are 1:292,201,338.
