Powerball Jackpot at \$448 Million Ahead of Wednesday Draw

Jackpot climbed almost \$70 million during week, at highest mark since October

MADISON, Wis. - The *Powerball* jackpot continues to climb and is currently at \$448 million entering Wednesday's draw. That figure is up almost \$70 million since last week and marks both the high for 2019 and largest since last October's "jackpot fever."

"Last fall, we saw a historic jackpot frenzy and this current run is beginning to have a similar feel to it," said Wisconsin Lottery Director Cindy Polzin. "Powerball is at its highest level in seven months and approaching a half billion dollars. As the momentum builds, players should enjoy the excitement while also remembering to play responsibly."

Wednesday's draw is the 22nd since the last Powerball jackpot (\$294 million) was won Dec. 26 in New York state. Should a Wisconsin resident win the jackpot, it would be the third time in history (2006 and 2017).

HOW TO PLAY

- Plays cost \$2 each
- Players must purchase tickets by 9 p.m. tonight to be included in the drawing
- Choose five numbers between 1 and 69 and one Powerball number between 1 and 26
- Sign your ticket and check it as soon as possible to avoid missing out on any prize you may have won

The odds of winning the *Powerball* jackpot are 1:292.2 million.

ABOUT THE WISCONSIN LOTTERY

The Wisconsin Lottery enriches communities statewide by giving back 93 percent of its revenue to winners, retailers, and Wisconsin homeowners.
