## From Cold Cuts to \$119,000 Badger 5 Jackpot

Waupaca County couple turns lunch meat shopping trip into good fortune

MADISON, Wis. - When the lunch meat supply is running low and a lottery ticket is added to the shopping basket, you might have the right receipe for good fortune. That was the case for a Waupaca County couple.

Marty and Bonny Myers of Iola, population 1,301 (2010 census) went beyond their usual routine for their grocery run. After a deli stop, Bonny decided to purchase a Badger 5 ticket on the visit to Sentry (125 Meadow Rd.) in Iola.

The ticket matched the winning numbers of 1, 3, 9, 10, 21 in Tuesday's drawing for a \$119,000 jackpot.

"We had heard there was an Iola winner, so we checked our tickets," Bonny told Lottery officials when claiming the prize Wednesday in Madison. "We went through a few lines on the ticket before we matched the winning numbers." She added that upon telling her husband, he responded with a colorful response of disbelief.

The good fortune was very timely for the couple. Marty had a recent health scare that required hospitalization. Bonny's birthday is just weeks away.

"We plan to use the money to pay off medical bills and the car," said Bonnie.
