Janesville Woman Claims Historic Prize *First \$100,000 win in All or Nothing history paid out Monday*

MADISON, Wis. – A Janesville woman claimed the first \$100,000 win in **All or Nothing** history Monday at Wisconsin Lottery headquarters. The game saw its top prize won in Saturday's drawing.

Michelle Finn purchased her winning ticket at **Casey's General Store (2601 W. Court St.) in Janesville** and matched none of the 11 numbers (1, 3, 5, 7, 10, 11, 12, 15, 17, 19, and 22) drawn April 13. Players who match all 11 numbers or zero of 11 numbers win a \$100,000 top prize.

A frequent Lottery player, Finn was informed of the new game by a friend and began playing it with increasing success since its April 7 launch.

"I won \$40 (by matching 2 or 9 of the 11 numbers) a couple of times already," Finn told Lottery officials. "I'm an avid Lotto player and love this new game."

Upon hearing that the winning ticket was sold in Janesville, Finn did not get around to checking her numbers until the following day and woke her husband to show him that she had won.

"I was shaking and crying when I found out that I had the winning ticket," Finn added. As for her winnings, Finn stated her intention to quickly become "debt-free."

All or Nothing is Wisconsin's first new Lotto game in five years. The unique \$2 daily game features eight ways to win a prize. The \$100,000 top prize is won by matching all 11 numbers or none of the 11 numbers. Matching 10 numbers or one number wins \$500, matching nine or two numbers wins \$40, and matching eight or three numbers wins \$4. No prizes are won for matching four, five, six, or seven numbers.

Drawings occur daily after 9 p.m. Tickets must be purchased before 9 p.m. to be included in that day's drawing. Additional information about All or Nothing, including a "how to play" video, can be found at **wilottery.com**.

ABOUT THE WISCONSIN LOTTERY
