All or Nothing \$100,000 Top Prize Sold in De Pere

Midday drawing produces winning ticket

MADISON, Wis. – An [All or Nothing](#) \$100,000 top prize-winning ticket was sold for the Wednesday, May 24, 2023, midday drawing. Purchased at **True North Riverside**, 1010 S. Broadway in De Pere, the winning ticket matched 11 of 11 numbers drawn. The winning numbers were 2-3-7-8-9-10-11-16-17-18-22.

Gina Verhage, True North Riverside manager, said, "I'm so excited about selling a \$100,000 winning ticket at my store!"

Wisconsin Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets over \$599 receive a two percent Retailer Performance Winning Ticket Incentive, up to \$100,000.

All or Nothing players can win the \$100,000 top prize by matching 0 of 11 numbers or by matching 11 of 11 numbers. The odds of winning the *All or Nothing* \$100,000 top prize are 1 in 352,716. Tickets are \$2 per draw. Drawings are held seven days a week, twice daily. Tickets must be purchased before 1:30 p.m. for the midday drawing and before 9:00 p.m. for the evening drawing.

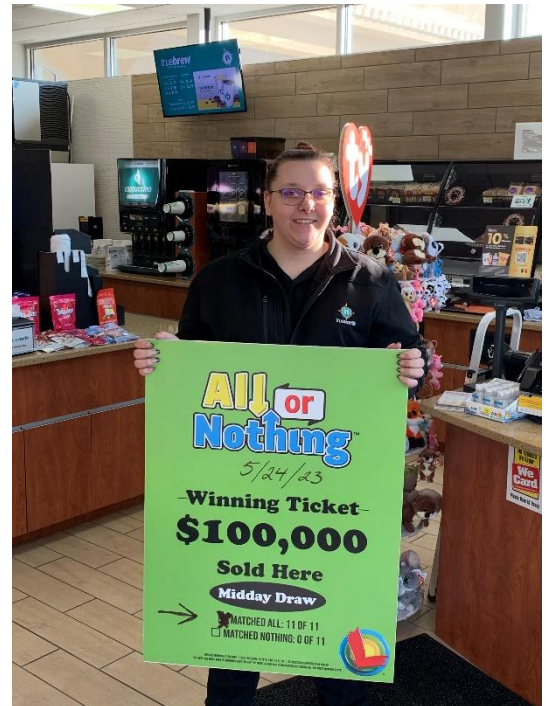
Players have 180 days from the draw date to claim their winnings. Information on how to claim a prize is available at wilottery.com/winners/claim-prize. All winning Lottery tickets need to be signed. Lottery tickets are bearer instruments; whoever signs the back of the ticket is considered the rightful owner.
