# Wisconsin-Only Lotto Games Come Up Big During Holiday Weekend 

## Mount Pleasant, Kenosha and Eau Claire sell jackpot and top prize winners

MADISON, Wis. - It was a winning weekend for Wisconsin-only lotto games. It started on Friday, with a pair of wins from the May $26^{\text {th }}$ drawings. A $\$ 100,000$ All or Nothing winning ticket matching 11 of 11 numbers (2-4-6-9-10-11-12-15-16-19-21) was purchased at Kwik Trip on 6801 Washington Ave. in Mount Pleasant, while a $\$ 79,000$ Badger 5 jackpot-winning ticket (1-5-24-27-29) was sold at $\mathbf{5 2}^{\text {nd }}$ St. Quick Shop Inc. on 3404 $52^{\text {nd }} S t$. in Kenosha.

The winning continued Saturday when a $\$ 1.3$ million Megabucks jackpot-winning ticket (11-12-18-25-39-40) was purchased at Kwik Trip on 2232 Otter Road in Eau Claire for the May 27 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ drawing.

Eau Claire Kwik Trip Assistant Store Leader Mary Landson said, "It feels great to sell a big winning ticket. We can't wait to meet the winner. Hopefully, they get to take a nice vacation after this."

All three Wisconsin Lottery retailers have a history of big wins. In 2017 the Eau Claire Kwik Trip sold a winning \$10,000 scratch ticket, while the Mount Pleasant Kwik Trip has sold winning tickets of $\$ 500,000$ (scratch game, 2022) and $\$ 128,000$ (Badger 5, 2019).

52nd St. Quick Shop Inc. has the most distinguished winning history of the three weekend-winning retailers. Earlier this year, 52nd St. Quick Shop Inc. sold a winning \$50,000 scratch ticket and a \$10,000 Badger 5 jackpot. In addition, the Kenosha
 location has sold a \$45,000 scratch ticket winner in 2020.

Wisconsin Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets over $\$ 599$ receive a two percent Retailer Performance Winning Ticket Incentive, up to $\$ 100,000$. The odds of winning the $\$ 100,000$ All or Nothing top prize are 1 in 352,716 . The odds of winning the Badger 5 jackpot are 1 in 169,911, and the odds of winning the Megabucks jackpot are 1 in 6,991,908.

Players have 180 days from the draw date to claim their winnings. Information on how to claim a prize is available at wilottery.com/winners/claim-prize.

All winning Lottery tickets need to be signed. Lottery tickets are bearer instruments; whoever signs the back of the ticket is considered the rightful owner.
