## \$50,000 Powerball Winning Ticket Purchased in Altoona

Four BIG winning Powerball tickets sold in Wisconsin in last five days

**MADISON, Wis.** – A \$50,000 <u>Powerball</u> winning ticket was sold at **Mega Holiday** on 1027 N. Hillcrest Pkwy in Altoona for the Wednesday, June 7<sup>th</sup> drawing. The winning ticket matched four of five numbers (16-21-29-53-66) plus the *Powerball* (2).

Winning *Powerball* tickets have come up in several parts of Wisconsin this week. In addition to last night's winner, on Saturday, June 3<sup>rd</sup> winning \$50,000 *Powerball* tickets were sold in Hustisford and Twin Lakes and on Monday, June 5<sup>th</sup> a winning \$1,000,000 *Powerball* ticket was purchased in Fond du Lac.

WISCONSIN LOTTERY

Players have 180 days from the draw date to claim their winnings. Information on how to claim a prize is available at <u>wilottery.com/winners/claim-prize</u>. All winning Lottery tickets need to be signed. Lottery tickets are bearer instruments; whoever signs the back of the ticket is considered the rightful owner.

Wisconsin Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets over \$599 receive a two percent Retailer Performance Winning Ticket Incentive, up to \$100,000.



The odds of winning a \$50,000 *Powerball* prize are 1:913,130 and the odds of winning a \$1,000,000 Powerball prize are 1: 11,688,054.

The estimated *Powerball* jackpot for the Saturday, June 10<sup>th</sup> drawing is \$308 million. The odds of winning the *Powerball* jackpot are 1:292,201,338.

*Powerball* drawings are Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday at 9:59 p.m. Tickets must be purchased before 9 p.m. to be included in a drawing. *Powerball* tickets are \$2 per play, with the option to buy the Power Play feature for an additional dollar.
