\$50,000 Powerball Ticket Sold in Appleton

Appleton Kwik Trip sells another big winner

MADISON, Wis. – A \$50,000 <u>Powerball</u> winning ticket was sold at **Kwik Trip** on 4085 E. Calumet in Appleton for the Monday, August 7 drawing. The winning ticket matched four of five numbers (6-13-20-35-54) plus the *Powerball* (22)

This Appleton Kwik Trip sold several big winning tickets in recent years including \$100,000 and \$30,000 scratch tickets and a \$132,000 <u>Badger 5</u> jackpot in 2019.

Powerball's top prize is climbing again, with the estimated jackpot of \$170 million for the Wednesday, August 9 drawing.

Players have 180 days from the draw date to claim their winnings. Information on how to claim a prize is available at wilottery.com/winners/claim-prize. Players should sign their tickets as soon as possible after their purchase. Lottery tickets are bearer instruments; whoever signs the back of the ticket is considered the rightful owner.

Wisconsin Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets over \$599 receive a two percent Retailer Performance Winning Ticket Incentive, up to \$100,000.

The odds of winning a \$50,000 *Powerball* prize are 1:913,130 and the odds of winning the *Powerball* jackpot are 1:292,201,338.

Powerball drawings are Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday at 9:59 p.m. Tickets must be purchased before 9 p.m. to be included in a drawing. *Powerball* tickets are \$2 per play, with the option to buy the Power Play feature for an additional dollar.

The odds of winning a *Badger 5* jackpot are 1:169,911.
