## FEATURES AND PROCEDURES

### 777

(Instant Scratch Game #2264)

- 1) Theme and name of the game: 777. Scratch each and every "?" play spot. Reveal three "7" symbols in a row (vertically, horizontally, or diagonally), win corresponding prize shown in the PRIZE LEGEND. Win \$3 for each "\$" symbol revealed.
- 2) Price of the ticket: Three dollars (\$3.00), or as otherwise set by the Administrator.
- 3) The prize structure including the number and value of prizes and the odds on each prize are as follows:

Odds and prize statements are based on initial game prize structure and may vary over the life of the game. Entry or non-entry of 777 tickets to the Lottery Super 2nd Chance drawings does not affect the prize structure of the 777 game.

- 4) The frequency of drawings: There are no drawings in the 777 game, however, for a period of time, at the discretion of the Lottery Division Administrator 777 tickets may count towards entry in Lottery Super 2nd Chance drawings. The Wisconsin Lottery will not be responsible for any neglect, failure or omission on the part of the U.S. Postal Service or any other delivery/courier service used to deliver a player's Super 2nd Chance Drawing mailing to the Wisconsin Lottery. The Lottery assumes no responsibility or liability for Super 2nd Chance tickets that are lost, or destroyed or otherwise disqualified from participation in a drawing when such tickets are in the control of the Lottery. All tickets sent to the Wisconsin Lottery to enter the Super 2nd Chance drawings become property of the Wisconsin Lottery and will not be returned. Only tickets sent to and received at the correct address for entry into the Super 2nd Chance drawing will be eligible for the Super 2nd Chance drawing.
- 5) The method of selecting winners: The holder of a ticket showing one (1) or more sets of three (3) "7" play symbols in a row (vertically, horizontally, or diagonally) in the uncovered grid play area of the ticket shall win the prize shown in the PRIZE LEGEND for that same number of winning sets of three (3) "7" symbols in a row. The holder of a

ticket showing one (1) or more "\$" play symbols in the uncovered grid play area shall win three dollars (\$3) for each "\$" symbol revealed.

For the purposes of these features and procedures, a winning set of three (3) "7" symbols in a row is defined as three (3) "7" play symbols located in three (3) adjoining spaces, in an unbroken vertical, horizontal or diagonal straight line within the completely uncovered grid play area of a ticket. The three (3) "7" symbols in a winning set must be immediately adjacent to each other (i.e., if there is a symbol other than a "7" between any of the three (3) "7" symbols, then it is a non-winning play.) Winning sets cannot be formed by combining "7" symbols that are not immediately adjacent to each other or are not in a straight line. Each winning set of three (3) "7" symbols can only be counted as one (1) individual set. However, the same "7" symbol may be used to make more than one (1) winning set of three (3) "7" symbols in a row provided that each winning set is only counted as one (1) individual set.

A winning grid play area can only win the highest prize shown in the PRIZE LEGEND for that same total number of winning sets of three (3) "7" symbols in a row as previously described in these features and procedures, plus three dollars (\$3) for each "\$" symbol revealed, as previously described in these features and procedures.

- 6) The method of making payment to winners:
  - A. Submission of the original ticket (not a copy), as provided below, shall be the sole method of claiming a prize.
  - B. Payment of prizes under six hundred dollars (\$600) may be made by presenting the ticket for validation and payment to any Wisconsin Lottery retailer by the claim deadline under 6(G).
  - C. The original winning ticket must be signed by a single human being. For-profit and non-profit entities, trusts, and other non-human beings are not eligible to play or claim a prize in this game. Payment of any prize totaling five hundred thousand, nine hundred ninety-nine dollars (\$500,999) or less may be made by either 1) signing the back of the original winning ticket, completing a Lottery claim form and presenting it in person to any Lottery office for validation and payment by the claim deadline under section 6(G), or 2) by signing the back of the original winning ticket, completing a Lottery claim form and mailing it for validation and payment to Lottery Headquarters in Madison. If claiming a prize by mail, the original winning ticket and Lottery claim form must be mailed to Lottery Headquarters in Madison in a properly addressed envelope with the postage duly prepaid by the claim deadline under section 6(G). Payment of any prize totaling five hundred and one thousand dollars (\$501,000) or more must be made by signing the back of the original winning ticket, completing a Lottery claim form and presenting it in person to the Lottery Headquarters in Madison for validation and payment by the claim deadline under section 6(G). Personal appearance may be waived at the Lottery Division Administrator's sole discretion.
  - D. Tickets are void if stolen, unissued, mutilated, altered, counterfeit, or otherwise fail validation tests. The Lottery at its sole discretion reserves the right to pay any

mutilated ticket based upon the facts and circumstances of the particular claim. Such action by the Lottery is final and non-reviewable.

- E. Tickets are void if misprinted. "Misprinted" means any mistake or difference from the original ticket or game specifications of any kind in the printing, manufacturing, packaging or other processing related to the production or distribution of the ticket caused by the raw materials, processes or handling of the ticket until its ultimate sale to the consumer/player. "Misprinted" includes but is not limited to the tickets being unreadable, misregistered, defective, or multiply printed. Also, "misprinted" includes errors in the computer software, computer hardware, code or programming of the game regardless of whether the errors were imbedded or caused by human action relating to any of the matters mentioned in this paragraph. The Lottery at its sole discretion reserves the right to pay any such "misprinted" ticket based upon the facts and circumstances of the particular claim. Such action by the Lottery is final and non-reviewable.
- F. All tickets sent to the Wisconsin Lottery for the purpose of redemption become property of the Lottery and will not be returned.
- G. The holder of a winning 777 ticket must claim the prize, in accordance with sections 6(B) or 6(C), within one hundred eighty (180) calendar days after game's end date or the prize shall be forfeited. If claiming a prize by mail, the postage prepaid envelope containing the original winning ticket and Lottery claim form must be postmarked on or before the one hundred eighty (180) day deadline. The envelope containing the original winning ticket and Lottery claim form must be received by the Wisconsin Lottery Headquarters in Madison within fourteen (14) calendar days after the one hundred eighty (180) day deadline or the prize shall be forfeited.
- H. Pursuant to Wisconsin's Open Records law (sec. 19.31-19.39 Wis. Stats.), the Lottery is required to disclose a winner's name, place of residence and, if acquired, likeness. If a player wins and claims a prize, the Lottery may use his or her name, likeness and place of residence without compensation for any purpose. Upon claiming a prize, a winner waives any claims against the Lottery and its representatives for any and all liability which may result from the disclosure or use of such information.
- I. Prize payments are subject to the provisions of sec. 565.30 Wis. Stats.
