FEATURES AND PROCEDURES

MAY MADNESS RAFFLE (2019)

A. <u>The theme and name of the game</u>:

The name of this game is MAY MADNESS RAFFLE. It is a game in which the player purchases a unique five-digit number from one (00001) to fifty thousand (50000). By purchasing a MAY MADNESS RAFFLE ticket, a player agrees to select the next number in sequence as determined by the lottery gaming system.

The winning numbers are randomly selected by a drawing. Set prizes are awarded in three (3) prize categories for exactly matching any five-digit number drawn in that category.

The game shall start on May 1, 2019.

For the purposes of the Lottery's Retailer Performance Program, this game is considered a jackpot game.

B. <u>The price of tickets</u>:

1. The price of a ticket is five dollars (\$5.00), or such other price as set by the Lottery Division Administrator, which entitles the purchaser to enter one play (a five-digit number from one (00001) to fifty thousand (50000)) in the drawing for which the ticket is purchased.

2. Tickets are only available for one (1) drawing.

3. Tickets cannot be cancelled, and there are no refunds. It is the sole responsibility of the player to verify the accuracy of the game plays. All plays are assigned by the computer at the time of purchase.

C. The prize structure, including the number and value of prizes:

1. All prizes are funded out of the tickets purchased with additional prize reserve funds used only if less than half the tickets are sold at game end. Approximately fifty percent (50%) of each dollar played is allocated to prizes. Prizes are awarded as follows:

2. Each five-digit number in this game is unique and shall appear on only one ticket. Consequently, there is a maximum of fifty thousand (50,000) tickets in this game. When and if all fifty thousand (50,000) tickets are generated on the lottery gaming system, no further tickets will be sold by the Lottery.

3. Any ticket that is not generated on the lottery gaming system by the draw break shall not be included in the drawing.

D. <u>The frequency of drawings</u>:

The one drawing will be held on June 3, 2019. Tickets for the drawing may not be sold after 11:59:59 PM on May 31, 2019. The drawing date and time may be changed by the Lottery Division Administrator to meet the operational needs of the Lottery.

For a period of time, at the discretion of the Lottery Division Administrator, MAY MADNESS RAFFLE tickets may count towards entry in Super 2nd Chance drawings. The Wisconsin Lottery will not be responsible for any neglect, failure, or omission on the part of the U.S. Postal Service or any other delivery or courier service used to deliver a player's Super 2nd Chance drawing mailing to the Wisconsin Lottery. The Lottery assumes no responsibility or liability for Super 2nd Chance tickets that are lost, destroyed, or otherwise disqualified from participation in a drawing when such tickets are in the control of the Lottery. All tickets sent to the Wisconsin Lottery to enter the Super 2nd Chance drawings become property of the Wisconsin Lottery and will not be returned. Only tickets sent to and received at the correct address for entry into the Super 2nd Chance drawing will be eligible for the Super 2nd Chance drawing.

E. The method of selecting winners:

Winning numbers are selected by a random drawing conducted in accordance with sec. 565.27 (2) Wis. Stats.

F. The method of making payments to winners:

1. Subject to Wisconsin Lottery validation procedures, an original ticket (not a copy) shall be the only proof of a game play or plays. The submission of a winning ticket, signed by one holder of that winning ticket, which shall be a single human being, to the Wisconsin Lottery or a Wisconsin Lottery retailer shall be the sole method of claiming a prize or prizes. For-profit and non-profit entities, trusts and other non-human beings are not eligible to play or claim a prize in this game. The Wisconsin Lottery is not responsible for lost or stolen tickets or tickets damaged after purchase such that validation information is not available to complete validation procedures on the ticket.

2. Tickets are void if stolen, mutilated, altered, counterfeit, unreadable, misregistered, defective, or otherwise fail validation tests. "Defective" includes but is not limited to errors in the computer software, computer hardware, code or programming of the game. The Lottery at its sole discretion reserves the right to pay any mutilated or misregistered ticket based upon the facts and circumstances of the particular claim. Such action by the Lottery is final and non-reviewable.

3. Prizes less than six hundred dollars (600) may be claimed and paid through a Wisconsin Lottery office or a Wisconsin Lottery retailer by the claim deadline under section F(7). Payment of any prize

totaling five hundred thousand, nine hundred and ninety-nine dollars (\$500,999) or less may be made by either 1) signing the back of the original winning ticket, completing a Lottery claim form and presenting it in person to any Lottery office for validation and payment by the claim deadline under section F(7), or 2) by signing the back of the original winning ticket, completing a Lottery claim form and mailing it for validation and payment to Lottery Headquarters in Madison. If claiming a prize by mail, the original winning ticket and Lottery claim form must be mailed to Lottery Headquarters in Madison in a properly addressed envelope with the postage duly prepaid by the claim deadline under section F(7). Payment of any prize totaling five hundred and one thousand dollars (\$501,000) or more must be made by signing the back of the original winning ticket, completing a Lottery claim form and presenting it in person to the Lottery Headquarters in Madison for validation and payment by the claim deadline under section F(7). Personal appearance may be waived at the Lottery Division Administrator's sole discretion. All prizes will be paid in cash or by check.

4. All tickets sent to the Wisconsin Lottery for the purpose of redemption become property of the Lottery and will not be returned.

5. Prizes may be paid after the drawing, once calculation of authorized prize amounts is completed.

6. Until such time as a signature is placed upon a ticket in the area designated for signature, a ticket shall be owned (held) by the bearer of the ticket. When a signature is placed on the ticket in the place designated, the person whose signature appears in the area shall be the owner (holder) of the ticket and shall be entitled (subject to validation requirements) to any prize attributable thereto.

7. The holder of a winning MAY MADNESS RAFFLE ticket must claim the prize, in accordance with section F(3), within one hundred eighty (180) calendar days after the drawing date or the prize shall be forfeited. If claiming a prize by mail, the postage prepaid envelope containing the original winning ticket and Lottery claim form must be postmarked on or before the one hundred eighty (180) day deadline. The envelope containing the original winning ticket and Lottery claim form must be received by the Wisconsin Lottery Headquarters within fourteen (14) calendar days after the one hundred eighty (180) day deadline or the prize shall be forfeited.

8. Pursuant to Wisconsin's Open Records law (sec. 19.31-19.39 Wis. Stats.), the Lottery is required to disclose a winner's name, place of residence and, if acquired, likeness. If a player wins and claims a prize, the Lottery may use his or her name, likeness and place of residence without compensation for any purpose. Upon claiming a prize, a winner waives any claims against the Lottery and its representatives for any and all liability which may result from the disclosure or use of such information.

9. Prize payments are subject to the provisions of sec. 565.30 Wis. Stats.
